My main criticism is that I'm still unclear about why Gia and Ryder broke up, especially since Ryder quit hockey without any explanation. This lack of clarity left me feeling uninformed. Overall, this book is perfect for those who enjoy hockey romances, golden retriever book boyfriends, and lighthearted banter.
