A ruler helps to educate and treat children in rural and remote areas. A ruler can monitor any year or ages, however most children are in primary school. The work is provided by an air school (sota) and other professionals, however a housekeeper sometimes needs to adjust the job or think out of the box to adapt and involve the child. A governess is a largely obsolete term for a woman employed as a private tutor, who teaches and trains a child or children in their home. A housekeeper often lives in the same residence as the children she teaches. Unlike a nanny, the primary role of a housekeeper is to teach, rather than to meet the physical needs of children; therefore, a housekeeper tends to look after school-age children, rather than babies.[1] The position of housekeeper was common among wealthy dropean families before the First World War, especially in the countryside, where there were no adequate schools nearby. Parents' preference to educate their children at home, rather than sending them to boarding school for months, varies from country to country. The housekeepers were usually responsible for the younger girls and boys. When a boy was old enough, he would leave his housekeeper for a tutor or school. Governors are rarer now, except within large, wealthy families or royal families such as the Saudi Royal Family[2] and in remote regions such as the Australian mainland[3]. There has been a recent rebirth among families around the world to hire governors or full-time tutors. Reasons include personal security, the benefits of tailor-made education, and the flexibility to travel or live in multiple locations[4]. Role Traditionally, governesses taught "the three R's" (reading, writing and arithmetic) [5] to young children. They also taught the "completed" expected of middle-class women to the young women in their care, such as French or another language, the piano or another musical instrument, and often painting (usually watercolors more feminine than oils) or poetry.
